Home – School Agreement

This Home – School Agreement is intended to give parents and pupils a clear understanding of what they can expect from Regent Independent School and what will be expected of them in return. These agreements are designed to raise academic standards by allowing parents and teachers to work together on behalf of the pupil.

These agreements have proved to be highly effective in other schools, and students have enjoyed significant academic benefits as a consequence of a dedicated and concerted effort by parents and teachers. However, the School can only provide quality teaching and facilities. Responsibility for learning lies with the pupil.

Regent Independent School will provide:

- A programme of courses delivered by suitably qualified and effective members of staff using appropriate facilities and resources.
- A friendly, caring, supportive and safe environment through a network of pastoral care and personal tutors.
- A programme of Personal, Social and Health Education to enable pupils to develop confidence and responsibility so that they can make the most of their abilities.
- A system of regular and effective assessment, recording and reporting to monitor and support pupil progress.
- A diverse programme of extra curricular activities which will provide support for learning and opportunities for leisure.

The pupil will:

- **Code of Conduct** – know and follow the rules and principles contained in the Code of Conduct.
- **Commitment** – demonstrate a commitment to fulfilling their academic potential by fully applying their efforts to study.
- **Independent Learner** – use study time effectively, be conscientious in their approach to homework and coursework by ensuring all deadlines are met, and by seeking the advice and expertise of teachers.
- **Punctual** – attend School every day and arrive on time for every lesson.
- **Contribute** – help the School achieve a sense of community by playing a role in societies, Houses and School activities and by helping fellow pupils.
- **Role Model** – older pupils act as a positive role model for the younger pupils in the Senior School by being helpful, respectful and courteous to all members of the School community.
- **School Uniform** – wear the School's uniform at all times.

The family will:

- **Code of Conduct** – ensure that the pupil knows and follows the rules and principles contained in the Code of Conduct.
- **Attendance** – ensure that the pupil attends School and provide a note of explanation if the pupil is absent.
- **Equipment** – ensure that the pupil arrives at the School each day with the necessary equipment and textbooks for every lesson.
- **Homework** - ensure that all homework is completed within the time set by the School.
- **School Uniform** – ensure that the pupil wears the School’s uniform at all times and that all clothing is clearly marked with the pupil’s name.
- **Contact Information** – provide up to date and detailed contact details, including email addresses, to ensure that the School and the family can work together to enable the pupil to fulfil their academic potential.
- **Home Time** – ensure that an adult is available at home for the pupil at the end of the School Day.
- **Contribute** – help the School achieve a sense of community by playing a role in School activities and events.
- **Parent’s Evenings** – attend both Parent’s Evenings during the academic year.
- **Changes** - notify the School of any change of circumstances that may affect the pupil.
